TILL SCHREIBER

Till Schreiber is the managing director of CDC. Till is responsible for mapping out the strategy and ensuring the successful performance of some of the largest antitrust damage actions in Europe. Since joining CDC in 2007, Till has steered the claims acquisition process with corporate companies across the EU and has been central in the negotiation and design of settlements in CDC's damage actions in Germany, the Netherlands and the Nordics. Till is a frequent speaker at international conferences on private enforcement of competition law.

Prior to joining CDC, Till practiced as an antitrust attorney for six years in a leading international law firm in Brussels, Cologne and Madrid. In this role Till represented companies in antitrust and cartel investigations. Till studied law at the universities of Bonn, Cologne, Barcelona and London (University College) and published a doctoral thesis on international competition law.

Jakob Rüggeberg heads the economic analysis and damage quantification team at CDC. Since 2009, he has worked on all aspects of cartel litigation related to data and evidence collection, economic analysis and damage quantification. His expertise ranges from the assessment of potential claims to managing large-scale damage quantifications in and out-of-court.

Before joining CDC, Jakob worked in competition consultancy and at the Amsterdam Centre for Law & Economics. He studied international economics at the Universities of Maastricht, Hamburg and Toulouse.
